Hospital2 Home	Voucher program for those eligible who are being discharged from hospital to home. Also offers short-term telephonic assistance to help with redeeming the vouchers if necessary and assist in the exploration of ongoing long-term services and supports. Caregiver Support/Kinship Support	Provides information and assistance to family caregivers to better understand how their caregiving role is impacting their lives. Assists caregivers in finding resources and services to help decrease the physical and emotional stress in their caregiving role in order to take better care of themselves and their loved ones. Services also assist grandparents caring for grandchildren.	Assessment to Determine What Services and Resources Will Assist the Caregiver.
